Position Title: Lecturer – Advanced Diploma in Integrative Counselling (BACP and NCPS Accredited Course) **Location:** Positions may be available at IMC Exeter and/or IMC Poole Hours:

• Weekday Course: Teaching occurs on one teaching day per week during term time, from 10:00 am to 5:15 pm.

- Providing well-structured teaching and learning experiences that involve interactive lectures, observation and demonstration of clinical skills, creative exercises, experiential work, reflective practice, and constructive feedback.
- Establishing and maintaining a warm and professional working alliance with students, offering reliable, consistent, relational, and supportive group leadership.
- Teaching both in-person and online, the knowledge, skills and abilities to teach the OPT (**Online and Phone therapy**) ensuring well-structured learning experiences that include interactive lectures, student skills observation, and demonstration of clinical skills.
- Managing group processes and development, including setting clear boundaries, supporting beginnings
 and endings, modelling respect and care, and facilitating group dynamics in a grounded, supportive, and
 empathetic manner.
- Marking and moderating assessments while providing detailed developmental feedback to students.
